

GUEST SPEAKERS

Advanced Lecture "On the Cusp"

"Using Teaching and Learning Principles to Improve Outcomes in Veterinary Medicine"

VDF is pleased to welcome Dr. Robert Fox, Professor Emeritus, University of Oklahoma.

Professor Robert Fox is Professor Emeritus of Educational Leadership and Policy Studies at the



University of Oklahoma in Oklahoma, USA. He is also Adjunct Professor of Family Medicine at the University's Health Science Center. Professor Fox was Project Director of the study – "Changing and Learning in the Lives of Physicians". The book reporting the results proposes a theory of learning and change.

Professor Fox has authored or co-authored more than 100 articles, book chapters, papers and invited presentations. He was Editor of the Journal of Continuing Education in the Health Professions and has published many books as an author or co-editor, including "The Physician as Learner (1994)"

and "The Continuing Professional Development of Physicians: Integrating Theory and Practice (2003)". In a University of Wisconsin's study of the most important books and journals in continuing medical education (CME), his three books were ranked number one through three. His most recent book with Piet DeBoer, "Changing patterns of lifelong learning: a study of surgical eduction" reports a global study of learning.

Professor Fox also has a research award named for him – The Robert Fox Award – from the Society for Academic CME for best research paper. He has received numerous awards and named visiting professorships, such as the Rosenstadt Visiting Professor of Medicine at the University of Toronto and the prestigious Coppelson Orator by the Federation of Medicine of Australia. He is also a recipient of the Francis Maitland Award, the Distinguished Service Award and the Special Award for Research from the Society for Academic CME.



Dr. Manfra Marretta earned her DVM degree from Cornell University in 1977.



LABORATORIES AND SCHEDULE

SUBJECT TO CHANGE

Veterinary dentistry is a complex specialty which requires years of education, training and practice. The wet labs and workshops offered by the Veterinary Dental Forum help practitioners to more effectively diagnose and intercept dental problems and treat or refer them appropriately. The lectures and labs (fundamental, intermediate and advanced) are designed to be educational, practical and interesting for those just getting started as well as for those well established in the field of dentistry. Pre-registered attendees will be required to sign in at each lab.

Feline Extraction Lab - Feline extractions are technically difficult. After a brief Power Point introduction, attendees will get right to work on cadavers for hands-on learning with personal attention from a board certified veterinary dentist and his assistants. Limited to 30 participants. This lab will be presented twice by different presenters. *Check schedule on page 17 for times.*

Canine Radiography Lab - "Positioning for Perfect Rads"-Veterinary dental radiography, in particular positioning is one of the most frustrating aspects of veterinary dentistry. The bisecting angle technique can be demanding and difficult to perform consistently. Positioning the patient, the sensor, and the tube head to create quality images can be challenging. A simplified approach can consistently produce quality images with less confusion if a few principles are followed and some variables removed. Limited to 20 participants. **(Techs and DVMs)** This lab will be presented twice by different presenters. *Check schedule on page 17 for times.*

"Fill" Me in on the Latest in Restorations - A one hour lecture, then hands-on laboratory covering the basic equipment and materials with step by step instructions for dentin bonding and composite restorations. Indications, diagnostics, and contra-indications for restorations will be covered. Following the lecture, participants will be given the opportunity to apply dentin bonding, prepare cavity preparations, fill preparations with composite materials and finish the restorations. Limited to 30 participants.

Regional Nerve Blocks for Dental Patients - This lab will teach the attendee some very practical, safe and costeffective ways of controlling pain during and long after oral surgery. You will learn to block strategic nerve points within the oral cavity. The use of opioids in conjunction with a local anesthetic will be discussed to extend the duration of the analgesia well into the next day(s). Many of the new multimodal pain management options will be thoroughly discussed. Limited to 30 participants. This is a two hour lab. It will be presented twice. *Check schedule on page 17 for times.*

Comprehensive Periodontal Technique, Debridement & Instrumentation Used in the Treatment of Periodontal Disease - This lab will cover instrument selection, usage and care for the treatment of periodontal idsease, inclusive of charting, identification of visual oral pathology, treatment planning, the use of ultrasonic and hand instrumentation, sharpening techniques, open and closed flap root planing and an overview of home care, the mainstay of oral health. This is a hands-on wet lab, utilizing extracted teeth, skulls and cadavers to recognize and treat pathology. An entry level for both veterinarians and technicians who are providing, or planning to expand dental services in their practice. A lecture will procede the hands-on portion. Limited to 30 participants.

Fundamentals of Canine Dental Extractions - This lab will teach participants how to surgically remove the most common teeth extracted in the canine patient: maxillary and mandibular canines and carnassials. The proper instruments used to create flaps that are tension free and more easily closed will be shown. Types of suture and needles will be discussed. The question of "how much bone can I remove" will be answered. After this lab each veterinarian will have new skills that they can use when they return to their practice. Limited to 30 participants. This is a four hour lab. It will be presented twice by different presenters. *Check schedule on page 17 for times*.

Feline Radiography Lab - This lab will cover the positioning and interpretation of intraoral digital dental radiographs of cats. A study from 1998, showed that teeth that appeared normal, had 41% significant findings upon radiographs and the abnormal teeth, had 53% additional findings. It is estimated that 70% of cats, over the age of 3 years, have some form of periodontal disease and that 30-50% of cats have tooth resorption. Therefore, without dental radiographs, we may be missing dental disease in over half of our feline patients. Limited to 20 participants. **(Techs and DVMs)** This is a two hour lab. It will be presented twice. *Check schedule on page 17 for times.*

Interfragmentary Wiring Techniques for Challenging Mandibular Fracture Repairs - Situations arise where various fracture repair techniques are possible for the restoration of occlusion and quick return to function. Advantages and disadvantages exist for both intraoral techniques for stabilization as well as techniques of open reduction internal rigid fixation using a ventral surgical approach to the mandible. This advanced laboratory is designed to discuss the implementation and practice of interfragmentary wiring techniques for the repair of challenging 2-piece and 3-piece mandibular fractures. Limited to 30 participants.

Regional Nerve Blocks and Periodontal Therapies for Technicians - This is a hands on lab in which attendees will learn the technique for delivering an effective regional nerve block for the dental patient. Periodontal therapies and hand instrumentation will also be taught. Instrument sharpening techniques will be demonstrated as well. Limited to 30 participants.

Maxillary Fracture Fixation - This laboratory will focus on maxillofacial fracture repair using various techniques such as interdental wiring, maxillomandibular fixation, and interfragmentary wiring. An introductory lecture will be given at the beginning of the laboratory. The focus

of the lecture will be mostly on maxillofacial trauma and achieving normal occlusion, a cornerstone of jaw fracture repair. Limited to 30 participants.

Surgical Endodontics - This laboratory will cover the techniques of surgical endodontics for canine patients. This will include canine and carsnassial teeth. Indications (and contraindications) approach, trephination, retroprep and retrofill. Limited to 30 participants.

Crown Preparations - Hands on laboratory covering crown preparation, impressions and stone models. Prosthodontics is the dental specialty pertaining to the diagnosis, treatment planning, rehabilitation and maintenance of the oral function, comfort, appearance and health of patients with clinical conditions associated with missing or deficient teeth and/or oral and maxillofacial tissues using biocompatible substitutes. Limited to 30 participants.

Dental Photography Lab - Attendees will learn how to obtain the best photography views of awake and anesthetized patients. The camera settings to optimize proper the color and overall appearance of the image will be taught. A manageable workflow will be covered from start to finish; from obtaining the image to getting the image into documents and records. Design of custom templates for treatment plans, medical records and client release instructions will be included. Using your X-ray images alongside of your photo images in custom documents will be part of this lab. Limited to 20 participants.

How to Really Read that Radiograph - Evaluating what lurks below the gum line paves the course of what needs to be done to help our patients. This presentation will look deeply into intraoral radiology interpretation with focus on periodontal, endodontic, tooth resorption and neoplastic disease in clinical cases. Limited to 20 participants. *This is a two hour lab. It will be presented twice. Check schedule on page 17 for times.*

Dealing with Complications of Extractions (Root tip removal, Oronasal Fistulae, etc.) - Participants will have the opportunity to practice techniques for dealing with complications of surgical extractions in dogs and cats. 1. Demonstration and practice of techniques for efficient removal of fractured root tips. Participants will have the opportunity to use a wide variety of instrumentation including dental elevators, luxators, periosteal elevators, periotomes, luxating-type elevators with modified periotome tips. Instruments will be available that allow for atraumatic removal of root tips, including root tip elevators, root tip forceps and surgical-length burs. 2. Oronasal Fistula Repair. Closure of iatrogenic maxillary canine tooth oronasal fistulae will be discussed and practiced. 3. latrogenic rostral mandibular fracture repair. Discussion and practice of approaches toward iatrogenic rostral mandibular instability in cats. Limited to 20 participants.

Specialists in Training: Surgery- Maxillectomy

Techniques in the Dog - This laboratory will provide participants with a step-by-step guideline on how to properly perform either a unilateral rostral maxillectomy or a central or segmental maxillectomy. Participants will be able to select which one of these maxillectomy procedures they would like to perform on a canine cadaver specimen by selecting the site and creating a simulated tumor on a cadaver specimen, measuring and marking the appropriate surgical margins, performing the maxillectomy procedure then closing the surgical site. **(AVDC Trainees ONLY)** Limited to 30 participants.

The Technician's Role in Endodontic and Prosthodontic Procedures - (AVDT Mentees ONLY) Limited to 20 participants.





Making shelter animals more adoptable since 2013

The Foundation for Veterinary Dentistry is a 501(c)(3) organization that promotes awareness of the importance of good oral care for companion animals, research, and education grants.



In 2013, The "Make Me Smile Project" was organized in concert with the generosity of veterinary equipment manufacturer, Dentalaire Products International. DPI provided equipment and Trustees of the Foundation volunteered training manpower at various animal shelters throughout the country. In 2016, Petco Inc. awarded a \$10,000 grant to the program.

The program is designed to give shelter veterinarians and technicians the training on providing comprehensive oral health, assessment and treatment (COHAT) of oral concerns for their animals that are placed for adoption. The COHAT will be conducted under general anesthesia and assessment will be done with full mouth radiographs and physical examinations. It is the goal of this dedicated group of veterinarians, technicians and dental hygienists who specialize in veterinary dentistry to create awareness for shelter personnel so they can provide treatment in-house.
