



"Principles and Applications of Oral and Maxillofacial CT and MRI"

Dr. Cissell joined the faculty of the University of California, Davis School of Veterinary Medicine in January 2016 as an Assistant Professor of Diagnostic Imaging. He earned a B.S. in Animal Science from the University of Connecticut where he played intercollegiate polo and developed an interest in musculoskeletal biomechanics. That interest led Dr. Cissell to become a veterinarian, graduating summa cum laude from the University of Pennsylvania where he received the Charles F. Reid Sports Medicine & Imaging Award. Following veterinary school, Dr. Cissell worked for two years in a private, mixed-animal practice in northern Utah before returning to academia to complete a residency in veterinary radiology and Ph.D. in biomedical engineering at the University of California, Davis. He received a Resident Leadership

and Professional Development award from the American Association of Veterinary Clinicians and received the highest possible marks upon completing the EXCITE Summer School in Biomedical Imaging at the Swiss Federal Institute of Technology and University of Zurich. Dr. Cissell's clinical and research interests include oral and maxillofacial imaging, large animal diagnostic imaging, and early diagnosis of cartilage injuries.



LABORATORIES AND SCHEDULE

SUBJECT TO CHANGE

Veterinary dentistry is a complex specialty which requires years of education, training and practice. The wet labs and workshops offered by the Veterinary Dental Forum help practitioners to more effectively diagnose and intercept dental problems and treat or refer them appropriately. The lectures and labs (fundamental, intermediate and advanced) are designed to be educational, practical and interesting for those just getting started as well as for those well established in the field of dentistry. Pre-registered attendees will be required to sign in at each lab.

Feline Radiography Lab - Periodontal disease and tooth resorption is commonly found in feline patients. We need intraoral dental radiographs to properly diagnose the presence and significance of the disease, along with helping to create a treatment plan. The normal techniques used to radiograph dogs don't always work with cats, due to their unique anatomy. In this lab, we will discuss and practice the various methods of overcoming the positioning challenges, such as the overlapping of the zygoma and cutting off the apices of the mandibular teeth. We will work to improve the quality and timing of our dental radiographic series. Common pathology will also be discussed. Positioning technique handouts will be given to all participants. Limited to 20 participants. (Techs and DVMs) This is a two hour lab. It will be presented twice.

Fundamentals of Canine Dental Extractions - This laboratory will focus on every step of surgical extraction in dogs: proper mucogingival flap design, tooth sectioning, bone removal, use of dental elevator and luxators, use of tooth forceps, alveoloplasty, periosteal releasing incisions and tension-free suturing. The laboratory will start with an hour of lecture including many videos on how to use different instruments and it will show extractions of carnassial and canine teeth from A to Z. Limited to 30 participants. (DVMs Only) This is a four hour lab. It will be presented twice by different presenters.

Endodontics II - Endodontic Debridement: Cleaning and Shaping the Root Canal System - This lab will build on the endodontic access laboratory that was offered in 2017 and will cover instrumentation of the pulp chamber for endodontic therapy. Principles and techniques of endodontic instrumentation will be taught. Participants will be able to use hand and rotary files. It is expected attendees of the laboratory already have knowledge and experience with endodontic access. Limited to 30 participants.

Regional Nerve Blocks for Dental Patients- This lab will teach the attendee some very practical, safe and cost-effective ways of controlling pain during and long after oral surgery. You will learn to block strategic nerve points within the oral cavity. The use of opioids in conjunction with a local anesthetic will be discussed to extend the duration of the analgesia well into the next day(s). Many of the new multimodal pain management options will be thoroughly discussed. Limited to 20 participants. This is a two hour lab. It will be presented twice.

Essential Periodontal Therapy: The Necessary Tools and Techniques for Diagnosis, Treatment and Prevention of Periodontal Disease - Lab covers instrument selection, usage and care for the treatment of periodontal disease, inclusive of probing, charting, identification of visual oral pathology, treatment planning, the use of ultrasonic and hand instrumentation, sharpening techniques and an overview of home care. Closed root planning and the use of Doxirobe is included. Hands on lab and lecture utilizing extracted teeth, skulls and cadavers. A necessary foundation for veterinarians and technicians providing dental services in their practices. These skills set the stage for advanced training in periodontal therapy and surgery. A lecture will precede the hands-on portion. Limited to 32 participants.

Canine Radiography Lab - "Positioning for Perfect Rads"-Veterinary dental radiography, in particular, positioning is one of the most frustrating aspects of veterinary dentistry. The bisecting angle technique can be demanding and difficult to perform consistently. Positioning the patient, the sensor, and the tube head to create quality images can be challenging. A simplified approach can consistently produce quality images with less confusion if a few principles are followed and some variables removed. Limited to 20 participants. (Techs and DVMs) This lab will be presented three times by different presenters.

Feline Extraction Lab - This laboratory will focus on every step of surgical extraction in cats: proper mucogingival flap design, tooth sectioning, bone removal, use of dental elevator and luxators, use of tooth forceps, alveoloplasty, periosteal releasing incisions and tension-free suturing. The laboratory will start with an hour of lecture including many videos on how to use each instrument and it will show extractions of different teeth from A to Z. The lecture will also cover crown amputations sometime necessary in cases of tooth resorptions.Limited to 30 participants. (DVMs Only) This lab will be presented twice by different presenters.

"Fill" Me in on the Latest in Restorations - A one-hour lecture, then hands-on laboratory covering the basic equipment & materials with step by step instructions for dentin bonding and composite restorations. Indications, diagnostics, and contra-indications for restorations will be covered. Following the lecture, participants will be given the opportunity to apply dentin bonding, prepare cavity preparations, fill preparations with composite materials and finish the restorations. Limited to 30 participants.

Mandibular Fracture Repair - This laboratory will focus on mandibular fracture repair on a Sawbones model with bilateral mandibular body fractures. A combination of techniques such as interdental wiring and interfragmentary wiring will be applied for reduction and stabilization. An introductory lecture will be given at the beginning of the laboratory. The focus of the lecture will be mostly on maxillofacial trauma and achieving normal occlusion, a cornerstone of jaw fracture repair. To that point, pharyngotomy tube placement will also be discussed and demonstrated to facilitate appliance placement and to maintain correct occlusion. Proper placement of wire and composite appliances in the mouth will be reviewed and practiced. Composite application will be practiced in combination with the four basic interdental wiring techniques (Ivy loop, Stout, Essig, and Risdon). Interfragmentary wiring techniques will be utilized for treatment of a three-piece mandibular body fracture. Standard equipment for minimally-invasive jaw fracture repair will be discussed and will be available for use during the laboratory. Stabilization of caudal mandibular o TMJ fractures with maxillomandibular fixation will be demonstrated. A limited number of canine and feline cadavers will be available for demonstration purposes and for supplemental practice by attendee as time permits. This laboratory would be ideal for those preparing for the AVDC examination and trainees in dental residency programs. Limited to 30 participants. (DVMs Only)

Complications of Extractions: Hands on Laboratory - This hands-on laboratory will help veterinarians understand and handle the most common complications of extractions, including oronasal fistula repair, fractured root tip removal and rostral mandibular fracture. There will be a required lecture session separately within the schedule to allow for maximum hands-on time in the laboratory. This lecture will also address how to avoid these common complications. Limited to 30 participants. (**DVMs Only**)

Dentistry Specifics for Veterinary Technician: Utilization of the Tools of the Trade - Station 1: Power instrumentation: specifics will be discussed in regards to ultrasonic scalers of different types as well as inserts and scaler tips, specifics as to differences and utilization for efficiency will be discussed and practiced. Specifics for the low speed and high speed handpieces will be taught and maintenance of these hand pieces practiced, emphasis on avoiding patient cross-contamination and ensuring longevity of the hand pieces stressed. High-speed bur basics will be taught for recognition of different burs. Station 2: Common dental hand instruments will be available for identification, periodontal instruments such as the hand scaler and curette will be utilized to practice holding and using these on the teeth to perform cleaning procedures. Sharpening will be taught at length on periodontal instruments as well as dental elevators and luxators. Station 3: Oral pathology, both recognition and documentation will be demonstrated and practiced. Use of common AVDC abbreviations will be stressed as well as the proper use of the dental probe/ explorer and dental mirror. Specific pathology will be staged to ensure that each student has opportunities to find commonly recognized pathology, also ensuring recognition of normal as it pertains to both the cat and dog mouth. Limited to 30 participants.

LABORATORIES AND SCHEDULE

Periodontal Flap Surgery Lab - This is a hands on lab demonstrating periodontal flap surgery in the small animal veterinary patient. We will initiate with a discussion of necessary equipment as well as indications (and contraindications). Following this, we will cover the various flap techniques for proper periodontal surgery. Next, proper treatment of the root surface will be presented. Proper follow up to ensure success will also be covered. Finally, the techniques of guided tissue regeneration will be taught. Limited to 30 participants.

Crown Preparations - Hands on laboratory covering indications for crown therapy, how to prepare a tooth for a crown and obtain proper margins, obtain appropriate impressions and bite registration and how to make stone models. Prosthodontics is the dental specialty pertaining to the diagnosis, treatment planning, rehabilitation and maintenance of the oral function, comfort, appearance and health of patients with clinical conditions associated with missing or deficient teeth and/or oral and maxillofacial tissues using biocompatible substitutes. Limited to 30 participants.

Introduction to Dental Radiographic Interpretation: "I Just Got a Dental Rad System and I Want to Know About Normal and Abnormal" -Evaluating what lurks below the gum line paves the course of what needs to be done to help our patients. This presentation will look deeply into intraoral radiology interpretation with focus on periodontal, endodontic, tooth resorption and neoplastic disease in clinical cases. Limited to 20 participants. This is a two hour lab.

Primate Dentistry and Beakistry Lab - Radiology and endodontics will be practiced on specimen primate teeth. "Orthobeakics" will be practiced on specimen bird beaks. This is a rare opportunity for participants to learn how to perform endodontics and restorative procedures on primates, and how to diagnose and treat beak issues. OR

Lions, Mountain Lions, Tiger: Radiology, Endodontics & Exodontics, oh my! Radiology, endodontics and exodontics will be practiced on specimen lions, tigers and mountain lions. This is a rare opportunity for participants to learn how to perform endodontics and exodontic procedures and practice their skills on large cats. (*Both Labs Ideal for Preparation for PEIVDF Mission Trips) These labs will be held in the same lab room. VDF management will contact you for selection after you register for the lab. Limited to 20 participants.

Rabbit and Rodent Dentistry Lab - Master the skills required to diagnose and manage one of the most frequent reasons for presentation of exotic companion mammals to your practice. Learn proper oral examination with the best equipment and perform these common procedures including occlusal equilibration, extract teeth both intraorally and extraorally and how to deal with abscesses. Limited to 30 participants.

The Technician's Role in Endodontic and Prosthodontic Procedures -(AVDT Mentees ONLY) - Endodontics is the branch of veterinary dentistry that involves the diagnosis and treatment of diseases of the pulp and periradicular tissue. This 2 1/2 hour laboratory will demonstrate the variety of methods used to diagnose endodontic disease as well as a variety of procedures that are utilized to treat endodontic disease. These procedures include: vital pulp therapy, conventional root canal therapy, and surgical root canal therapy (apicoectomy). This laboratory will focus on the veterinary dental technician's role in preparing for and assisting in these procedures. Prosthodontics is that branch of dentistry that deals with the artificial replacement of natural teeth or associated structures. Prosthodontics in veterinary dentistry usually means crowns. There are many cases in veterinary dentistry where crown restoration is indicated. This 2 1/2 hour laboratory will demonstrate the techniques involved with preparing teeth for crown restoration, impression taking for crown restoration as well as the procedure for crown cementation. Differences between the various crown choices (full jacket cast metal vs. porcelain) as well as 3/4 crowns will be demonstrated as well. This laboratory will focus on the veterinary dental technician's role in preparing for and assisting in these procedures. Limited to 30 participants.

Specialists in Training: CT, MRI, Radiology Lab- "Principles and Applications of Oral and Maxillofacial CT and MRI." Limited to 30 participants. Vet Tome Assisted Surgical Extraction Techniques in Dogs and Cats - This laboratory is intended for practitioners that have confidence and experience in fundamental extraction and mucoperiosteal flap techniques. An introduction and use of the mechanical Vet Tome (Periotome) to assist in severing the periodontal ligament to facilitate extractions will be presented. The Vet Tome will be utilized for simple extractions in addition to a tool to enhance surgical extraction of the strategic teeth in the dog and cat. Challenges with extraction of a large dog dilacerated maxillary 3rd incisor, augmentation and simplification of canine tooth surgical extractions, and the use of the Vet Tome to approach difficult surgical extractions will be performed in the laboratory. A 25-minute presentation to the lab attendees at the beginning of the laboratory is necessary. The lecture will cover the principles of Vet Tome instrumentation and the mechanical principles behind the atraumatic technique. A presentation of how and where the Vet Tome can be utilized to facilitate and enhance extraction techniques will be presented. The Vet Tome can decrease bone removal necessary for difficult extractions and for removal of tooth roots at dilacerated angles. The Vet Tome offers practitioners with an additional method to effectively and efficiently extract teeth while minimizing collateral hard and soft tissue trauma. Limited to 16 participants. (DVMs Only)

Rostral Maxillectomy and Mandibulectomy - Oral Surgery - Hands on laboratory covering indications for rostral mandibulectomy and maxillectomy, appropriate margins required for the most common oral tumors, how to determine surgical margins, proper surgical techniques, equipment and materials needed and performing the surgeries step-by-step. Limited to 30 participants. (DVMs Only)


