



Martin Kennedy is a board-certified veterinary anesthesiologist with over a decade of clinical experience in both private practice and university settings. Dr. Kennedy attended Cornell University where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemical Engineering, and then the University of Wisconsin where he earned his Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree. Following his graduation from veterinary school, Dr. Kennedy completed a rotating internship at the University of Minnesota, and then a residency in Anesthesia & Pain Management at the University of Wisconsin. Dr. Kennedy then joined a busy multi-specialty referral practice in Cincinnati, heading the anesthesia service there until December 2019. He then worked at the University of Minnesota as an associate professor of Anesthesia & Pain Medicine, with a strong focus on clinical teaching. In the Fall of 2022, he joined the Veterinary Dental Group and now works exclusively with dental specialty hospitals. He has particular interests in total intravenous anesthesia (TIVA), the management of high-risk patients, multimodal pain control, and teaching all things anesthesia.

Dr. Peggy Kelley, MD, FACS, FAAP

Peggy Kelley MD is a pediatric otolaryngologist currently practicing at Providence St. Vincent Medical Center in Portland, Oregon.

Dr. Kelley completed her undergraduate degree at Stanford University with honors and her medical degree is from the University of Pittsburgh. After completing a residency in Otolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery at the University of Rochester she completed a pediatric fellowship at Cincinnati Children's Hospital.

Peggy was Associate Professor of Otolaryngology, Head and Neck surgery at the University of Colorado until 2020 when she moved home to Oregon. Her research included maternal-fetal collaboration, ethics of tracheostomy decision making and frenulotomy. She was the Chair of the Education Committee and current President of the Interamerican Society of Pediatric Otolaryngology, Treasurer for the American Society of Pediatric Otolaryngology and Executive Board member of the Section on Otolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery for the American Academy of Pediatrics.

While at Children's Hospital Colorado she started the Vascular Anomalies clinic, and was Director of the Microtia, and Voice clinics. Surgery for congenital anomalies and palate surgery for voice improvement are areas of interest.

Dr. Kelley enjoys lifelong learning and is looking forward to collaborating with her daughter, Jennifer Kelley DVM at the upcoming conference.

Dr. Kristen Lowe, DDS, MS

Dr. Lowe is a Board-Certified orthodontist with a subspeciality in managing patients with craniofacial conditions, such as cleft lip and palate and hemifacial microsomia. She's an Associate Professor in the Division of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery at the University of Colorado and the founder of the Craniofacial Orthodontics program at Children's Hospital Colorado.

She strongly believes in giving back to her profession and is the current President of the Rocky Mountain Society of Orthodontists, the Membership Committee Chair for the American Cleft Palate Craniofacial Association, and she sits on the Board for the American Association of Orthodontists Foundation.
